## Approval of Minutes from October 22, 2014

The Council took up minutes from the prior meeting. Minutes were approved.

## <u>Texas Water Development Board Update from Chairman Bech Bruun</u>

Chairman Bruun provided an update on several items including the first round of funding awarded through the State Water Implementation Fund for Texas (SWIFT) and the status of the 2016 Regional Water Plans.

## • Review of the Council's activities at Texas Water Day at the Capitol

The Council presented all Blue Legacy Awards as part of Texas Water Day at the Capitol, hosted by the Texas Water Foundation, on March 26, 2015. Moving forward, the presentation of the Blue Legacy Awards will continue to occur during the legislative session.

#### Update on best management practices

The Council discussed several 'active' best management practices, and Council workgroups determined the status and extent of efforts needed to move from 'active' to 'final'. Additional discussion focused on existing best management practices and additional practices to consider for development. New codes and standards have been adopted by various industry groups that might be useful for developing these best management practices. The Council also discussed a possible volunteer network to perform peer reviews of program evaluations.

## • Review of process related to expiring terms and filling of vacancies

Staff gave an overview of the process related to expiring terms for Council members. Nominations are solicited for terms expiring August 31, 2015, for seven interest groups (Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, Regional Water Planning Groups, River Authorities, Environmental Groups, Higher Education, Electric Generation, and Rural Water Users) with new terms to expire in 2021. Members are selected from nomination pool and appointed by the Texas Water Development Board.

#### Review and discussion on water conservation bills from the 84th Texas Legislature

An overview of the following water conservation bills from the 84th Texas Legislature was provided:

House Bill 949 (Relating to the obligation of certain retail public utilities to mitigate their system water loss);

House Bill 1902 (Relating to the regulation and use of graywater and alternative onsite water):

Senate Bill 551 (Relating to the duty of the Water Conservation Advisory Council to submit a report and recommendations regarding water conservation in this state); and

Senate Bill 1356 (Relating to exemption from the sales tax for certain water-efficient products for a limited period).

## • Discussion on future goals and involvement from the Council

The Council discussed how Senate Bill 551 (and related legislative report recommendations) would affect the report timeline, especially as it relates to getting approval from the heads of

the five state agencies represented on the Council. The next meeting will include a more detailed discussion of this topic.
